Recently I was asked to write a feel-good story for REST.Q, which is a nonprofit organization that looks after abandoned, stray or injured animals on Galiano and Mayne Islands. I became a member of the REST.Q board this year, and was trying to think of a heartwarming animal story to relay, but thought the best article I could write would be about the selfless work of Joanna Pollard, our director for REST.Q, since its inception 17 years ago.

There are so many wonderful and dedicated individuals who donate time and energy into making REST.Q successful, but without Joanna leading this group, I'm not sure REST.Q would continue to exist.

Each and every day of the year, morning and night, rain or shine, Joanna goes out to feed the feral cats at several feeding stations on the island. As well, on her property Joanna feeds and looks after a number of stray cats that have access to a shelter that has heating and bedding. She takes all of these cats to the Mayne Island Vet Clinic to be spayed or neutered, as well as any injured or sick cats. This is usually on a weekly basis. Additionally, while on Mayne, Joanna will pick up medication for Galiano pet owners who can't make the trip themselves. Donations and money raised to support REST.Q are used exclusively to support the welfare of stray or struggling animals.

Every Saturday morning from 9am to 3pm when the Saturday market is running, you will see Joanna at the REST.Q booth selling cards and crafts, and taking donations to support the well-being of stray pets and injured wildlife, or to assist islanders who are struggling with the costs of

looking after their sick pets. Joanna told me about one gentleman who stopped by the




booth and asked what REST.Q is most in need of. Joanna told him that a generator would be very helpful in the winter to provide heat for the cat shelter when the power goes out. He wrote a cheque for that amount right there and then.


I don't know when Joanna rests. If she is not donating her time to the running of REST.Q, she can be found managing and running Galiano Soap Works or volunteering at the Galiano Vet Clinic every two weeks.

REST.Q has taken in approximately 500-600 cats, some dogs and rabbits since its inception, and has had them spayed or neutered, and has found homes for 99% of these animals. The other 1% usually find their way into Joanna's home.

Joanna is truly a selfless person who puts her heart and soul into caring for all of the special creatures in need on Galiano and Mayne Islands.







Always with us

Ronaye Hudyma was a lifelong entertainer who did not waste time limiting herself. She was equally comfortable on the stage, on the television screen, in person – always well-attired – and on the print page. She felt equally comfortable and showed her talents in the United States, Canada, Japan, Sri Lanka, Mexico and many other countries. She was truly an artist without borders. Ronaye was both an interesting and enigmatic person, but whatever she was she brought to Canada and particularly to Mayne island in British Columbia.

She spoke of her adventures in Nashville, the music center of America, and the challenges of being accepted and successful in the American entertainment industry. There she sang, recorded and wrote lyrics. Perhaps the most permanent memory of Ronaye is her books of poetry, which include "How Many Heartbeats?: The Evolution of the Human Spirit" and "With a Broken Wing: Expressions of the Human Spirit". Anyone who reads these will find the books having gems that appeal to them. As Ronaye was a lover of life and of creatures, especially the small, it is no wonder that she wrote beautiful poems that express that love.

Consider:

"So I said to my cat...

You're not really a cat, you know.

And I'm not really a human.

We are in disguise, incognito, just pretending.

We are one and the same."

Important to the BC Gulf Islands, when Ronaye left all of us, she donated her life savings and her house to an animal rescue organization. Her generosity will be felt, though unrecognized, by countless lost, hungry and homeless animals who wander the Gulf Islands. They will be better for the fact that she lived...as will all of us. May we recognize her gifts for the creatures who cannot! May her memory be a blessing on the living.
